## Edwards Opens Its Doors to the Community

On Friday, September 19, Dynege's Edwards Power Station hosted a reception, ribbon cutting, and tour of the plant in partnership with the Peoria Area Chamber of Commerce. This event was the Edwards Station's official welcome into the community as a Chamber of Commerce member and community partner. It served as an opportunity for other chamber members to come and learn about Edwards Power Station, as well as for Edwards employees to meet and chat with local stakeholders. The plant was proud to open its doors to its new neighbors to give them a firsthand look into how power is generated.

Edwards employees welcomed about 30 guests from the chamber, as well as local elected officials and labor representatives, and guests were given an overview of power plant operations. Everyone then joined Edwards Plant Manager Ted Lindenbusch outside to celebrate the cutting of the ribbon. Afterwards, guests were given a tour of the Edwards plant, which included stops and discussion at the turbine deck, control room, boiler/feeders, a rooftop overview of the plant, and Clean Coal operations. Those guests who opted to go to the roof got to see the freshly painted stacks up close.

This event was an important opportunity to highlight the role the plant plays in the community – supplying reliable, environmentally compliant power; contributing to the local tax base;
